## GETTING TO TURKU

Nestled in the southwestern corner of Finland, Turku is just a short two-hour drive from Helsinki.

Arriving in Turku is a breeze with its airport, harbor, bus depot, and three railway stations, offering a variety of options to suit your travel preferences.

### By air

Turku airport provides direct flights from Stockholm, Riga, Gdansk, and Rome, or convenient connections via [SAS](#) through Stockholm or [airBaltic](#) through Riga, [wizzair](#) through Gdansk, and Rome

Flight durations to most Western European cities are approximately 4 hours, including layovers. With its compact size, Turku airport is just 8 km or a 25-minute bus ride from the city center. Additional flight options are also available from Helsinki-Vantaa airport, approximately 170 km or a 2.5-hour bus journey from Turku.

### By sea

Turku is in close proximity to Sweden, with regular ferries connecting Stockholm and Turku, making a stop in Mariehamn on a daily basis. The journey typically takes around 11 hours. [Viking Line](#) and [Silja Line](#) are the primary ferry operators linking Turku and Stockholm. Turku harbor is situated just over three kilometers from the city center, easily accessible by foot or Föli bus.

### By bus

For those traveling to Turku from elsewhere in Finland, taking the bus is a popular and cost-effective choice, particularly when booking in advance. Use the Matkahuolto [route planner](#) to map out your journey and explore various transportation options. A bus ride from Helsinki to Turku typically takes a little over 2 hours.

### By train

Another convenient transportation option is the train, with [VR](#) managing Finland's railway network. Trains are reliable, safe, and run on schedule.

Hourly services operate between Helsinki and Turku, with multiple daily services available from Tampere, each journey lasting less than 2 hours.
